Nauti enjoyed all music, but she especially loved gospel always singing off key. Nauti would often have singing and dancing contest with her sister Zalandria who she would leave to babysit her silicone babies.

We regret her passing but she lived her life to the end the way she always wanted to as an independent woman. We as her family would like to stress wearing a mask due to Covid-19. It took Nautika at the age of 20. Covid-19 has no preference on race, age or disability.
