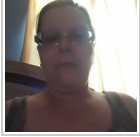
“ I'll never forget the day he first told me he loves me

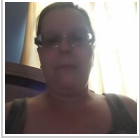

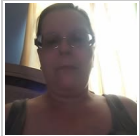
“ To open up and to share everything with him because were in it together and lean on the lord more.
